Read Across America Day is March 2, 2021.

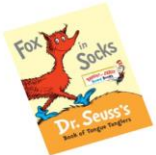
Throughout the week, we will be celebrating reading and one of our favorite authors, Dr. Seuss.

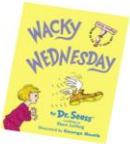

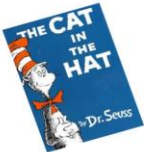

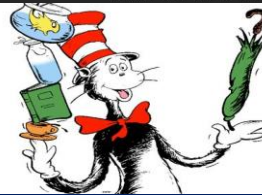

WHY READ 20 MINUTES AT HOME?

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.
