
Frequently Asked Questions

- **Who can schedule a Child Find appointment?**

Parents or legal guardians can schedule a Child Find appointment. Grandparents, doctors, teachers, or anyone concerned about a child's development can share Child Find information with parents. Parents must give written permission for screenings.

- **Who will screen my child?**

The Child Find team consists of a school psychologist, a speech/language pathologist, and related service provider, as needed.

- **How long is a Preschool Child Find appointment?**

The initial appointment lasts approximately 1 hour. Some children will be referred for a follow-up if needed. These appointments will range from 45 minutes to 2 hours.

- **What should I bring to the appointment?**

One (1) proof of residence
Medicaid Card (if applicable)
Outside agency reports or therapy notes regarding your child.

- **Where do I bring my child for the appointment?**

Preschool (2 ½-5)

What is Child Find?

Child Find is a component of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) which requires states to identify, locate, and evaluate all children with disabilities between the ages of 3 and 21, who need early intervention or educational services.

Preschool

Spartanburg School District Seven provides free developmental screenings throughout the year for children between the ages of 2 ½ and 5 through the Child Find screening process.

A multidisciplinary team will meet with you and your child to conduct a screening in the areas of:

**Hearing and Vision
Developmental Skills
Communication Skills**

Following the screening process, the team will review the results with you and will provide recommendations. Our team will schedule follow-up appointments based on the child's individual needs, as appropriate.

School Age

WHEN?

- We do preschool screenings multiple times throughout the school year.
- All screenings require an appointment.
